### A Note From Bryan. . . . It's the little things...

it's just those little things that might be judged by others to be insignificant that mean the most to you in your relationship with your spouse. Chances are great that you did not marry someone who was a "larger than life" kind of character. That probably had nothing at all to do with you falling in love. It could be some hidden aspect of your spouse's personality that endears them to you. It is something meaningful to you that you treasure for yourself and you share it with no one else.

On another plane of life your spiritual life is often buoyed by your church family but what was it that drew you to Woodstock? For some it is the family feel; being accepted and loved by others in a way that is deeply felt and understood. For others it is the belonging or the faithfulness to truth. The point is that it is very unlikely that some far reaching program brought you in and kept you here. It wasn't some grand, far-reaching mission that keeps you coming back to this congregation. It is the simple, seemingly insignificant acts of love and kindness; it is the feeling you get from being here that draws you and keeps you.

Not to discourage you from big dreams, but why is it that we strive for spiritual heights that are unachievable or way out of reach? It is a good practice to reach for things that are just beyond your grasp but doable. It is these things that make you grow. However, when we dream too big we are disappointed with our own mediocrity and we blame ourselves and other and our faith can be weakened rather than being built up. Today I want to encourage you by showing you some simple but effective things for which to strive this year that will please God and help you grow. We are going to observe some things that are well within your reach and things that you can get excited about. We are about to discover what an amazing and forgiving God we serve.
