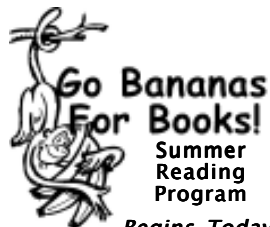
Vacation Bible School

A Note From Bryan... A Legacy of Freedom

A legacy of freedom is what God has imprinted upon human history. God created man to live in freedom. God has also given us the equipment to cope with enslavement. Men don't seem to know what to do with freedom. The evidence for such a statement abounds in the revealed word of God. The very first man and woman were created and given everything they needed to thrive on the earth. They only had one rule and their insatiable curiosity for why they had that one constraint led to the downfall of man. The access to the tree of life was overshadowed by the temptation to know the mystique of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

The evidence of man's inability to remain free is found in the plight of the nation of Israel. When God created a nation to call His own they were unprecedentedly free and eventually enslaved themselves to a king to be like the nations around them. Their desire to be like those other nations led them to be swallowed up by the nations around them. The further and further they went away from God the closer and closer they came to tyranny. When tyranny overtook them and swept them into captivity once more it was too late. In 1 Samuel 8:18 Samuel conveyed God's message to the people who demanded a king warning them that when they cried out because of their oppression He would not hear them.

As God's people in a once free nation we have enjoyed unprecedented freedoms. We have been privileged to be part of a great experiment in freedom. Too many people do not know what to do with that freedom and seek to be enslaved in tyranny not having to think for themselves or provide for themselves. What is it that we can do as Christians to turn the tide? What sort of involvement is right for us as Christians in this hour when we are threatened by people who have moved so far away from God? These are questions you and I share and questions we will explore together from the Scriptures.
