### A Note From Bryan. . . Increase Our Faith

"Lord, increase our faith..." said the disciples to Jesus in Luke 17:5, 6. Jesus' reply to this request was that if they had faith the size of a mustard seed they would be able to uproot trees; that nothing would be beyond their ability. In Philippians 4:13, we are reminded that we can do all things through Christ who gives us our strength. The mustard seed is one of the smallest of all seeds, but has the power in it to grow to become a large plant under the right conditions. This was such an apt illustration, and one that Jesus used on a number of occasions.

Think of how many great efforts started from small seeds. Most great organizations began as an idea in a person's mind, and grew to what we know today. IBM and Federal Express are two examples of large companies that began with a concept in someone's mind. We all want, in varying degrees, to have a fulfilling spiritual life, and that fulfilling spiritual life begins with a seed of faith and a small effort in the beginning. Under the right conditions of determination and diligence, your faith can grow to become something visible and exemplary.

In Matthew 17:20, the disciples wondered why they were unable to heal the epileptic boy, and Jesus told them it was their unbelief. He continued with the statement that if they had faith like a mustard seed they could move mountains, and that nothing would be impossible for them. He also told them how important the discipline of prayer and fasting were to developing this sort of faith. Our demon is that persistent doubt and unbelief in our own lives. Our mustard seed of faith is the capacity to realize God's power to save. Our faith is to trust Him to care for us, sustain us each day, and to keep His promises. We also ask God to increase our faith.
