A Note From Bryan. . . . East of Eden

East of Eden refers to the place where Cain lived after he was driven from the presence of God. In our time the name has become synonymous with a novel by John Steinbeck and a film starring James Dean. The greater story of Cain and his sin is such an interesting study in human nature. In fact, that seems to be why this true event was written down so that we would read it and consider our own lives.

There are three basic principles that will be discussed today. First is the fact that we all seek acceptance from God and from other people in our lives. Sometimes we are looking for acceptance from the wrong people and for the wrong reasons and this usually happens earlier in our lives. Second, we too can become angry with God. Make no mistake Cain's anger was toward God but God wasn't physically available for Cain to act out against. When we are angry with God all too often other people pay the price for our anger and resentment. This also shows us the propensity we have for self-destructive behaviors and how we harm other people with negative behaviors.

Third, Cain's error was made by choice. God has given us the power to choose. He told Cain directly that if he did well he would be approved. Consequently if he did not do well sin was at the door but he should rule over it (paraphrase). You and I have the ability to rule over sin and reign over our actions. In short, God expects us to be personally responsible and accountable. God will hold us responsible for our sins, 2 Corinthians 5:10. As you read and study Genesis chapter four you may come up with other applicable and meaningful principles that you wish to apply in your own walk with God. I look forward to our time together today.
